Members nominating for the Committee of Management are expected to become familiar with the U3A Manningham Constitution.

The Committee of Management is collectively responsible for ensuring that U3A Manningham complies with the Associations Incorporation Reform Act and the U3A Constitution.

Celebrating the Achievements of U3A Manningham Migrant English Tutors

In the year 2000, U3AM launched the Migrant English Program (MEP) to provide free tuition to migrants in the wider community. The objective of the MEP was to assist migrants to acquire English skills which would help in their integration into the community and, hopefully, to enable their participation in U3AM activities.

The MEP trained U3AM members as Migrant English tutors who would, in turn, provide one-on-one tutoring to migrants to improve their speaking, listening, and understanding in English. The one-on-one tuition is open to all adult migrants from the wider community.



Achievements of Migrant English Tutors

Seven of our tutors have been providing tutoring services for over ten years and nineteen tutors have done so for more than five years. To commemorate the achievement of these significant milestones, U3AM has awarded a Certificate of Appreciation to the following twenty-six tutors.
